– Gateway to West Shoreline

133 Trees at Risk

Once they are gone,
they are gone forever

Where: Department of Transportation building on Dayton between N 160th and N 155th Streets.

Proposed Development: The DOT renovation, new building for vehicle storage and a new building for the Dept of Ecology. The City of Shoreline owns the Right of Way property surrounding the WSDOT property on all three streets. The proposed changes include:

- New concrete curb
- 5' landscape strip
- 8' sidewalks within the Right of Way
- Parallel parking on the east side of Dayton
- Increasing the lane for the bus stop

These street improvements come at a HUGE cost... **the removal of approximately 133 existing, healthy trees on Dayton, N 160th and N155th.** Many of these mature firs and cedars have been here for decades and are home to a long list of birds, squirrels, and other wildlife.

The removal of 133 trees will obviously affect the health of our Highland Terrace neighborhood and will open-up traffic noise and views from Aurora Ave. The iconic tree lined boulevard on Dayton will be gone forever.
